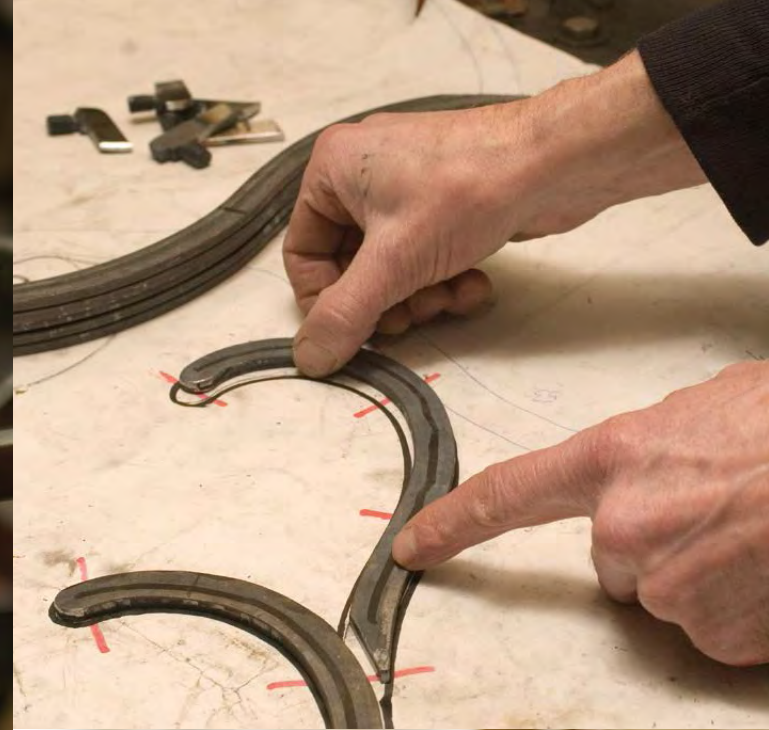
## Our History is alive

The 19th century saw some milestones of Lobmeyr's creativity such as the fruitful collaboration with Theophil Hansen or the first electrical chandeliers with T.A. Edison. Beside the technical innovation, it was the focus on the highest quality in the manufacture, which drove these creations. Having no workshop for chandelier manufacture Lobmeyr relied on trusted and skilled manufacturers to collaborate with to execute such outstanding designs.

Jos. Zahn & Co, founded 1780, the year Maria Theresia died, was the most trusted and reliable manufacturer throughout the 19th century, meeting Lobmeyr's high demand on the skills of the artisans. Besides working for Lobmeyr, the family Zahn fathered archetypical designs that are regarded as common good today. The Maria Theresia Chandelier or the typical Viennese Biedermeier Chandelier are just a few examples.

In 1971, lacking succession within the family, Zahn approached Lobmeyr asking to be embraced root and branch by Lobmeyr. Stefan Rath, Jr. of the 5th generation followed the call to join his brothers Harald and Peter and merging the two companies, two workshops and two philosophies. He married Zahn's roots in crafts and authenticity with Lobmeyr's thrive towards highest quality and design. His engagement enabled Lobmeyr to create true originals of traditional designs, like crafted in their time own era and brought into this day.

## Viennese Baroque

The Austrian Emperors always aspired the savoir-vivre of the French Kings. Gossip has it that for those cast bronze chandeliers with their rich pendants of rock crystal the budget was too short. This challenged a unique Austrian interpretation of baroque splendour.

Early examples emanate a stern elegance that appears calm and timeless. Others rivalled with their French ideal, both in shape and sparkle. Jos. Zahn & Co. set the milestone with their creation of the now well-known Maria Theresia Chandelier from 1780 that became patron of the whole heritage, well into the 20th century.

The frame is of iron, expertly wrought by hand. This is then leaf-gilded and clad with fitted glass bands or numerous crystal rosettes to augment the impression. The brilliance comes with the typical crystal pendants. An important detail is then the number and size of these pendants, but foremost a lively variety of different shapes that give the chandelier its energy.

## Historism Series

The late 19th century saw one of the most creative periods in Lobjmeyr's chandelier development. Typical elements from Baroque or Hellenistic period combined with a new understanding of aesthetic and elegance shaped the typical style of the Ringstrassen-period. For Lobjmeyr Theophil Hansen was an early champion of this movement marking one of the high points of Lobjmeyr's history. When T.A. Edison came to Vienna in 1881 Ludwig Lobjmeyr partnered with him and continued this streak over the turn of the century, propelled by a new technology: the electric light bulb. The initial technical requirement of hanging bulbs inspired Lobjmeyr to an all-new aesthetic with masterpieces for the Hotel Sacher, the Lord Mayor's office and the Imperial Palace.

At the exposition in Milan in 1883 Lobjmeyr presented a new take on the traditional bag-and-tent chandeliers, that into whole bodies of light with the new electric light. The pieces completely do without any candles. Funnily, later examples again show candles as the clientele seemed to need this homage to the living flame.

A playful variation of the Viennese Baroque frames is to furnish them not only with clear crystal but also with colourful glass fruits, very popular in the 1830ies and again in the 1950ies. From the French tradition stem also very classical baroque designs such as the famous Louis XVI. with the elaborate bronze frames and large crystals or the abundantly decorated cast brass fixtures in Rococo style.

Wrought iron is an archaic material. In the hands of an expert blacksmith this apparent crudeness can be elaborated to unfathomed degrees of delicacy. Wrought iron can be bent, curled and twisted to create interesting yet massive frames. However, the artisan can also shape filigree ornaments such as flowers and petals to tender the roughness of the material.

## The Wiener G'rüstl

A Biedermeier original

Josef Zahn created this Biedermeier classic in the 1820ies, exactly where the workshops of Lobmeyr are bustling to this day. It is one of those designs that grew larger than itself, to become an example for its period and to remain to the present day beyond Lobmeyr alone. The chandelier consists of a delicate frame of thin brass bands. The Lobmeyr artisans decoratively emboss main belt is with traditional patterns using original tools from the period. The tender crystal chains and icicles imbue the fixtures with a humble elegance.

Most Biedermeier chandeliers feature clear and simple outlines. Despite this sternness, all fixtures show elaborate details in the manufacture that supplement their calm elegance and sophistication. The brass can be polished and varnished for a lasting shine, allowed to darken with time or given a patina for a sombre character. Another option is partly coloured crystals.

## Nordic Empire

Between Russia and Sweden

In Northern Europe the sun is a rare blessing the people cherish intently. This love even shows in their specific aesthetics as motives of the sun, ice and fertility. The most beautiful chandeliers of this elegant style illuminate the Hermitage in St. Petersburg. In the mid-19th century Jos. Zahn & Co. documented them at their origin and added them to the repertoire.

The Corn Cob Chandelier is one of the milestones of the Russian Empire chandeliers. Its long and elegant shape reminds one of the namesake cob. On the column sit elaborately decorated leaf-blades pointing upwards to the crown. This is a strong metaphor of the sun with a double-corona of thin brass band.

Common motives are curves and circles that symbolise the sun as well as crystal prisms and tender chains that mimic icicles and frost buds.

Most examples feature hand-refined cast elements and finely embossed brass belts. The metal frames are usually antique gilded. Other surfaces can give a stunning new character.

The grandfather of an emerited craftsman spent his apprenticeship with a chandelier maker in France. Returning to Vienna he not only brought all the skills and knowledge but also the tools and designs of the French Empire. Besides manufacturing these extravagant black-gold items in their full authenticity we have an archive of original fittings and decorations, opening a wide field for customisation and individualisation.

Around 1800 Zahn took over the whole archive and sample stock of a Dutch chandelier maker. This acquisition laid the foundation for our expertise in manufacturing these early baroque chandeliers with the authentic heavy brass cast and with all the original decorative elements and heraldic symbols. Originally made with a shiny polish a subtle antique finish especially evokes the air of centuries long past. A rub with orange oil gives it perfect care for a slow natural patina.

## Islamic Art

Rediscovering heritage (700-900)

In 1975 we heard the call to bid for the chandeliers of the new extension to the Prophet's Mosque in Mecca. Stefan Rath, Jr. travelled to Saudi Arabia and was surprised to see Viennese Baroque chandeliers of the Maria Theresia style in the lighting schedule. "You cannot want to have the chandeliers of the infidels' ballrooms..." were his reported words before he went to Alexandria to research ancient Islamic art and style. Lobjmeyr's alternative proposal to design and manufacture a new Islamic prototype of lighting struck the nerve of the principal. It marked the beginning altogether new style: a modern Islamic design deeply rooted in the culture and traditional aesthetics.

A few years later Lobjmeyr was again called to design the chandeliers for the extension of the Grand Mosque in Medina. Our prototypes soon became archetypes of this new style and inspired chandelier design for decade.
